Austin . . . Onion producers in South Texas expect to harvest 15,200 acres of spring onions this year. This forecast is 2,700 acres more than last year.

Planted acreage for the 2005 spring crop is up 5 percent from a year ago, to 15,200 acres, and up 19 percent from the 2003 crop.

Expected acreage for harvest in the Lower Rio Grande Valley is estimated at 11,100 acres, up 26 percent from 2004.

In the San Antonio-Winter Garden and Laredo areas, producers expect to harvest 4,100 acres, up 11 percent from last year.

United States onion acreage planted for spring is forecast at 40,300 acres, up 1 percent from 2004 and up 12 percent from 2003.
