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FEBRUARY 1 TEXAS CATTLE ON FEED On:

DOWN 2 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

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AUSTIN . . . Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Texas feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.72 million head on February 1, down 2 percent from a year ago. According to the monthly report released by the Texas Agricultural Statistics Service, the estimate was up 1 percent from the January 1 level. Producers placed 425,000 head in commercial feedlots during January, up 9 percent from a year ago, and 5 percent above the December 2004 total.

Texas commercial feeders marketed 395,000 head during January, down 8 percent from last year and down 6 percent from the December 2004 total.

On February 1, there were 2.27 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 83 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down slightly from last year, and up 1 percent from the January total.

January placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 350,000 head, up 8 percent from the December total. Marketings were down 3 percent from last month to 322,000 head.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States in feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 11.3 million head on February 1, 2005. This inventory was 2 percent above February 1, 2004.

Placements in feedlots during January totaled 1.89 million head, 7 percent above January 2004. January placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds totaled 380,000 head; 600-699 pounds totaled 458,000 head; 700-799 pounds totaled 628,000 head; 800 pounds and greater totaled 419,000 head. Marketings of fed cattle during January totaled 1.78 million head, up slightly from 2004.
