AUSTIN . . . Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Texas feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.95 million head on July 1, up 7 percent from a year ago. According to the monthly report released by the Texas Agricultural Statistics Service, the estimate was up 2 percent from the June 1 level. Producers placed 550,000 head in commercial feedlots during June, up 21 percent from a year ago, but down 27 percent from the May 2005 total.

Texas commercial feeders marketed 480,000 head during June, down 3 percent from last year and the same number as last month.

On July 1, there were 2.45 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 83 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was up 7 percent from last year, and up 2 percent from the June total.

June placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 461,000 head, down 26 percent from the May total. Marketings were up 1 percent from last month to 405,000 head.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States in feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 10.4 million head on July 1, 2005. This inventory was 3 percent above July 1, 2004.

Placements in feedlots during June totaled 1.77 million head, 7 percent above June 2004. June placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds totaled 412,000 head; 600-699 pounds totaled 347,000 head; 700-799 pounds totaled 480,000 head; 800 pounds and greater totaled 530,000 head. Marketings of fed cattle during June totaled 2.07 million head, 1 percent below 2004.
