UP 8 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

AUSTIN . . . Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Texas feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.89 million head on August 1, up 8 percent from a year ago. According to the monthly report released by the Texas Agricultural Statistics Service, the estimate was down 2 percent from the July 1 level. Producers placed 400,000 head in commercial feedlots during July, up 1 percent from a year ago, but down 27 percent from the June 2005 total.

Texas commercial feeders marketed 450,000 head during July, down 4 percent from last year and down 6 percent from last month.

On August 1, there were 2.40 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 83 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was up 9 percent from last year, and down 2 percent from the July total.

July placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 333,000 head, down 28 percent from the June total. Marketings were down 6 percent from last month to 379,000 head.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States in feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 10.1 million head on August 1, 2005. This inventory was 2 percent above August 1, 2004.

Placements in feedlots during July totaled 1.68 million head, 2 percent below July 2004. July placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds totaled 400,000 head; 600-699 pounds totaled 338,000 head; 700-799 pounds totaled 465,000 head; 800 pounds and greater totaled 475,000 head. Marketings of fed cattle during July totaled 1.92 million head, slightly below 2004.
