AUSTIN . . . Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Texas feedlots with capacity

of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.94 million head on December 1, up 7 percent from a year ago.

According to the monthly report released by the Texas Field Office, the estimate was down 1 percent

from the November 1 level. Producers placed 495,000 head in commercial feedlots during

November, up 55 percent from a year ago, but down 26 percent from the October 2005 total.

Texas commercial feeders marketed 510,000 head during November, up 19 percent from last

year but down 2 percent from last month.

On December 1, there were 2.45 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern

High Plains, 83 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was up 7 percent

from last year, but down 1 percent from the November total.

November placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 403,000 head, down 29 percent

from the October total. Marketings were down 3 percent from last month to 421,000 head.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States in feedlots with a capacity

of 1,000 head or more totaled 11.7 million head on December 1, 2005. This inventory was 3 percent

above December 1, 2004.

Placements in feedlots during November totaled 2.05 million head, 17 percent above

November 2004. November placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds totaled

660,000 head; 600-699 pounds totaled 650,000 head; 700-799 pounds totaled 420,000 head; 800

pounds and greater totaled 315,000 head. Marketings of fed cattle during November totaled 1.70

million head, 4 percent above 2004.
