Action item statement from the Managing for Excellence Plan

Develop a plan for the continued implementation of PART (Program Assessment Rating Tool) goals for Research and Development.

Scope Statement from the Managing for Excellence Project Management Plan

Formulate a plan to accomplish PART goals for R&D; e.g., produce a 10:1 return on investment, increase non-BOR cost-sharing, and improve technology/information transfer.

Approach and Methodology

Fostering continued improvements in program effectiveness is central to the PART goal objectives. The Team's approach was to review the history and evolution of the Science and Technology Program in light of the spirit of Managing for Excellence. Reports prepared by the National Academy of Sciences and others on the role of research to meet the water resource challenges of the 21st century were reviewed. Both stakeholders and other Federal resource management agencies were interviewed.

Deliverables

A report was prepared which addresses both Action Items 34 and 35. (Action Item 35 addressed the Science and Technology Program Steering Team. A separate decision document was prepared for Action Item 35 and a decision memorandum was signed by Commissioner Johnson on March 2, 2007.)

Conclusions

The Team finds that the R&D Office has initiated appropriate actions to implement and administer the programmatic efforts that underpin the associated PART goal tracking. The R&D Office has also initiated actions to develop and use contemporary interactive on-line knowledge bases and information technology to facilitate efficient integration of these program improvements and automate associated PART goal tracking.

Continued support from Reclamation leadership will help achieve the programmatic improvements initiated by the R&D Office. Regional involvement will also be essential for successful implementation. Improving regional engagement and achieving objectives that embody the programmatic objectives associated with the PART goals are consistent with the tasks to be addressed by the new Science and Technology Program Steering Team established under Action Item 35 (decision memorandum signed by Commissioner Johnson on March 2, 2007). As such, no additional M4E formal recommendations or follow-on actions are necessary to implement Action Item 34 conclusions.
