




- high quality

IF BRAND-NAME DRUGS AND GENERIC **DRUGS HAVE THE SAME ACTIVE** INGREDIENTS, WHY DO THEY LOOK **DIFFERENT?**

In the United States, trademark laws do not allow generic drugs to look exactly like the brandname drug. However, the generic drug must have the same active ingredients. Colors, flavors, and certain other parts may be different. But these

things don't affect the way the drug works and they are looked at by FDA.

DOES EVERY BRAND-NAME DRUG HAVE A GENERIC DRUG?

No. When new drugs are first made they have drug patents. Most drug

patents are protected for 17 years. The patent protects the company that made the drug first. The patent doesn't allow anyone else to make and sell the drug. When the patent expires, other drug companies can start selling the generic version of the drug. But, first, they must test the drug and the FDA must approve it.
