


PER CAPITA INCOME GROWTH IN 2005

Per capita personal income grew 4.2 percent in 2005, 1 percentage point less than its 5.2 percent growth rate in 2004. Connecticut led the nation with a per capita income of \$47,519. Louisiana's per capita income of \$24,582, 29 percent below the national average, put it in last place.
