**Corrective Action Information
Qualifying Conditions**

- The corrective action files posted at <http://www.cms.hhs.gov/MCRAdvPartDENrolData/> contain corrective action information that pertain to Medicare Advantage (MA) and Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) organizations operating under contract to CMS to provide Medicare services and prescription drugs to Medicare beneficiaries.
- In order to ensure compliance with Medicare program requirements, CMS oversees the operations of these organizations through day-to-day monitoring and periodic performance audits.
- When CMS determines that an organization does not comply with Medicare program requirements, the organization is directed to take all actions necessary to comply with Medicare program requirements. This often times takes the form of a “corrective action requirement (CAR)” directive (letter) from CMS.
- The CARs listed on this file result from program audits and “ad-hoc” compliance interventions. Ad-hoc compliance interventions occur when CMS identifies non-compliance outside the audit environment.
- CMS utilizes a risk assessment methodology to determine which organizations it audits. As a result, CMS does not audit each MAPD and PDP organization annually.
- Reasons why an MA or PDP organization does not appear in these files include: no CMS audits conducted in the time period displayed (January 2006 to the date of the file), no open deficiencies from scheduled audits or ad-hoc compliance issues.
