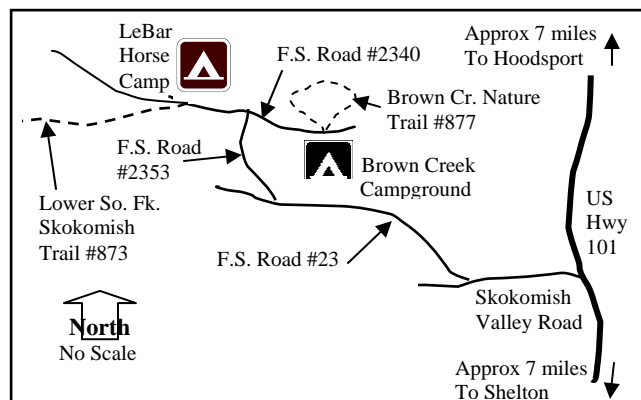
SPRING SUMMER FALL WINTER



**ACCESS:** From US Highway 101 turn west onto the Skokomish Valley Road (6 miles north of Shelton and 7 miles south of Hoodspport), drive west on the Skokomish Valley Road from the George Adams State Fish Hatchery for about 5 miles to FS Road #23. Turn right onto FS #23 and drive 9.0 miles to FS Road #2353. Turn right onto FS #2353 and drive approximately ¾ mile to the South Fork Skokomish River Bridge. Cross the bridge and make a sharp turn to the right onto FS Road #2340. Brown Creek Campground is located ¼ mile beyond this point.

**OPPORTUNITIES:** Hiking, camping, fishing, and opportunities to view wildlife are available in the area. The Lower South Fork Skokomish Trail #873 is located off of FS Rd. 2353 near LeBar Horse Camp. The Upper South Fork Skokomish Trail #873.1 is located at the end of FS Rd, #2361. The Brown Creek Nature Loop Trail #877 is a short, family oriented hike around a beaver pond beginning near the campground well.

**FEE:** Regular \$10.00 camping fee covers two licensed passenger vehicles and a maximum of eight people. (50% reduced fee with Golden Age/Access & Interagency Senior/Access passes.) **The two vehicle rule includes any combination of the following:** passenger cars, trucks, and/or recreation vehicles (NOTE: boat and recreation trailers are not considered passenger vehicles). An additional \$5.00 fee is charged for each passenger vehicle over the limit. No more than 8 people per campsite.

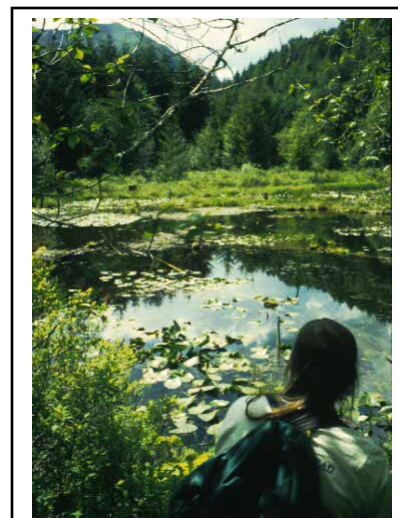


Maximum stay is 14 days. Pets must be leashed.

**FACILITIES:** There are 20 campsites in Brown Creek Campground: twelve will accommodate trailers and RVs up to 20 feet in length and eight of the sites are suitable for tents. Well water, tables, fire rings, and vault toilets are available. Please pack out your garbage and leave a clean campsite. The campground has been moved out of the riparian zone and the former campground is a day use area.

**OFF-SEASON:** Portions of Brown Creek Campground are open year round. During the off-season potable water is not available.

**SETTING:** Campground is located along the shore of the South Fork Skokomish River at the confluence with Brown Creek. Evergreen conifers and hardwoods provide lots of shade at this campground.
