SAMOA'S BUDGET FOR FY 1998 & 1999

In late July 1997, the Congress sent to the President the Interior Appropriations Bill which included \$23.1 million for the operation of the American Samoa Government and \$10.1 million for construction projects in the territory. While the operations money for the territory remains the same, we managed to get \$4 million extra for much needed capital improvement projects. In addition, this year's budget includes \$1 million for technical assistance for the territories. Technical assistance funds a number of programs in the U.S. insular areas. This year American Samoa received technical assistance for several projects including training to operate Treasury Department's new financial management computers and a giant clam aquaculture project.

Other good news for American Samoa is an increase of \$500,000 in medicaid funding in the current fiscal year. This amount will be adjusted in future years for inflation. This increase is in response to our request to President Clinton to provide additional medicaid funding for all the U.S. insular areas. This is particularly significant because the overall medicaid program has been cut by \$13 billion.

There is also considerable new funding to provide health care to

children whose families cannot afford medical care. This should provide additional funding for our hospital.

There are also other tax breaks contained in the legislation. Unless the Fono acts to change our local income tax law, the change in federal tax code will also benefit taxpayers in American Samoa. This issue discussed most often is the \$500 child tax credit. In general terms, this credit will be available to families with annual incomes between \$18,000 and \$110,000. There are also tax credits for families with students in college which can total \$1,500 per year for the first two years of college, and another \$1,000 per year for the second two years.

For those who travel, the federal tax on roundtrip air to the United States will go from the current \$6 to \$24. While this is a substantial increase, at one point the House was pushing a proposal to increase the tax to \$24 and add a 10% ticket tax as well. This would have been a very substantial increase, and it was only through the lobbying efforts of Members of Congress from outlying areas, including American Samoa, that we were able to get that proposal scaled back.

E ui na tumau le aofa'i o le tupe mo le fa'agoioina o le Malo, o le lua ai lenei o tausaga ua mafai ona fa'aopoopo le \$4 miliona mo galuega fa'apitoa e fa'aleleia atili ai le atunu'u. E iai fo'i tupe ua fa'agaaga mo le fesoasoani i le alualu i luma o agavaa masani i tulaga o galuega i ofisa. E tele polokalama i teritori eseese o le Iunaite Sitete ua fa'atupeina e le nei fesoasoani. O le tausaga ua tuana'i, na maua ai e Amerika Samoa se fesoasoani mo ana galuega fai e iai le a'oa'oaina o tagata faigaluega o le Ofisa o le Tupe ia malamalama i se polokalama fou i komepiuta mo le fa'avasegaina ma le fa'aaogaina o tupe, fa'apea fo'i le galuega i le faafofoaina o tugane vai tetele.

O le isi tala fiafia mo Amerika Samoa, o le \$500,000 ua fa'aopoopoina i le nei tausaga faaletupe mo le Medicaid aua i latou o lo'o agava'a mo lea fesoasoani, o le a fai fuafua mo tausaga o i luma aemaise le tau o le soifuaga. O le nei fa'aopoopoga na mafai ona fa'ataunu'uina i sa matou talosaga ia Peresitene Clinton ina ia fa'aopoopoina lea vaega tupe i le Medicaid aua atunu'u o lo'o tausia ma va'aia e le Iunaite Sitete, e aofia ai ona teritori (insular areas). E taua tele lenei fa'aopoopoga pe afai e fa'atusatusa atu o le nei polokalama o le Medicaid ua matua'i fa'aititia e tusa ma le \$13 piliona ua toeseina.

O le pili lava lea na fa'auluina mo le tausaga ua mavae na a'afia ai lafoga ua fa'aititia mo tagatanu'u ta'ito'atasi (individual tax breaks). Vagana ai e suia e le Fono Faitulafono o Amerika Samoa a tatou lava tulafono tau lafoga, o lo'o solosolo lelei pea tulafono tau lafoga a le Malo Tele e aoga lea mo tagata lafo lafoga i Amerika Samoa. O le mataupu tau lafoga sa feutaga'i tele iai o le \$500 mo le tamaititi e to'atasi i se aiga, e tusa lea ma nai aiga e i le va o le \$18,000 i le \$110,000 le tupe maua i le tausaga. O loo iai fo'i tupe fa'aititia mai lafoga mo nai aiga o lo'o iai fanau i kolisi ma iunivesite, e o' o atu i le \$1,500 i le tausaga mo tausaga muamua e lua o le kolisi, ma le isi \$1,000 mo tausaga e lua mulimuli i le kolisi.

Mo i latou o lo'o femalagaa'i i le 'ea, ua iai nei le lafoga fa'ale-Malo e totogi i le Iunaite Sitete mo e malaga ma toe fo'i mai (roundtrip). Ua si'i mai le \$6 le lafoga i le \$24. O se si'itaga tele lenei, peita'i na iai fo'i le vaitaimi na u'una'i ai e le Maota o Sui le tasi manatu e si'i le lafoga i le \$24 ma fa'aopoopo le 10% i le lafoga o le tau o le pasese e malaga ai. Lona uiga ana fa'ataunu'uina, ua matua'i tele atu le tupe e totogi mo femalaga'iga, ae ona o le pulunaunau o sui o le Konekeresi mai sitete ma motu e mamao o le Iunaite Sitete, e iai Amerika Samoa, lea na mafai ai ona fa'aititia le si'itaga na fuafuaina.

MORE FEDERAL ASSISTANCE FOR SAMOA

In 1997, American Samoa received substantial federal assistance to upgrade and improve some of its aging infrastructure. Included is \$1.5 million to extend the runway at **Fitiuta airport** in Manu'a; \$495,000 to fund revisions to the environmental assessment for the extension of the runway at **Tafuna International Airport**; and \$450,000 to acquire and install a security system at Tafuna International airport.

Other federal assistance for 1997 includes:... \$146,000 for the Marine Sanctuary at **Fagatele Bay**;... under Job Training Partnership Act (**JTPA**) American Samoa received \$158,000 for adult training, \$66,000 for the Summer Youth Program, \$422,000 for Title II-C youth programs, and \$183,000 for dislocated workers; ... **Local law enforcement** received \$563,625 from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) to hire additional police officers; the American Samoa Criminal Justice Planning Agency (ASCJPA) received \$33,000 under the Delinquency Prevention Act; and \$377,820 under a DOJ block grant also went to the ASCJPA. The Office of Justice Programs awarded the American Samoa Government \$929,290 under the Byrne Formula Grant Program to develop and strengthen local criminal justice programs.

... The Department of Public Health

was awarded \$283,521 for Samoa's Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program... \$983,000 was awarded to the local **Department of Commerce** under a Community Development Block Grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to carry out a range of local community programs. HUD also awarded the Department of Commerce \$252,000 under the Home Investment Partnership (HOME) Act and \$32,000 under the Emergency Shelter Grant.

... the **American Samoa Council on Humanities** received a grant for \$215,200 from the National Endowment for the Humanities to promote local activities that encourage and develop an appreciation for the preservation of our cultural resources.

... the **Department of Education** received \$5,694,921 for fiscal year 1997.

I would like to commend Governor Sunia and the American Samoa Government for their diligence in applying for and tracking these and other federal grants (too numerous to be named here).

As always, I will do my part to assist ASG, particularly in the Congress, to ensure that American Samoa receives the type of federal assistance our territory sorely needs.

O le Ofisa o A'o'ga e \$5,694,921 sa maua mo le tausaga tipe e 1997. CONGRESS REAUTHORIZES VA HOME LOAN PROGRAM FOR SAMOA VETERANS

In early November, the Congress passed the legislation authorizing the VA Home Loan Program for American Samoans and other Native Americans.

Under the first authorization, passed in 1992, loans were approved for 48 new homes in American Samoa. With the new authorization, I am encouraging all American Samoan veterans who need a loan to build a new home or construct an addition to an existing home to contact the American Samoa Development Bank for application forms.

The reauthorization of this program would not have been possible without the strong support of Senator Daniel Akaka, Congressman Lane Evans, and Congressman Neil Abercrombie.

I am extremely pleased to have participated in moving this legislation forward and will continue working to ensure that our veterans receive all the benefits they are entitled to receive.

\$500,000 WORTH OF MEDICAL QUIPMENT ARRIVE IN SAMOA

Three years ago, Senator Daniel Inouye of Hawaii worked to enact a law that would require the United States military to provide transportation (free of charge) for medical equipment to American Samoa. Since then, we have used this law to transport to American Samoa millions of dollars worth of medical equipment we helped acquire from closed military bases and other facilities.

Recently, we worked with the United States Air Force and Air Force Reserve to transport approximately \$500,000 worth of medical equipment donated by Project CURE of Denver, Colorado, South Seas Christian Ministry, and the Southern California Evangelistic Association (SCEA).

I am extremely grateful to Papaliitele Jack Thompson of South Seas Ministries, Dr. Rich Sweeny of Project CURE, and Mike Maxon of SCEA for the commitment and sincere desire to assist our Samoan people with their dire health care needs.

After visiting LBJ Hospital several months ago, I contacted Papaliitele to see if South Seas Christian Ministries could provide some assistance to the only health care facility in American Samoa. He contacted Dr. Sweeny and Mr. Maxon. Sweeny and Maxon immediately traveled to American Samoa to visit LBJ hospital. Upon their return, arrangements were made to collect and ship to Samoa much needed medical equipment and supplies.

I would like to thank the United States Air Force for their assistance, and Senator Inouye, without whose help none of this would have been possible.

AMERICAN SAMOA PLANS TO COMMEMORATE CENTENNIAL

I have drafted legislation, soon to be introduced, in support of the American Samoa Government's efforts to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the raising of the U.S. Flag in American Samoa.

Working from Washington, my efforts will be focused in three areas:

...I will soon introduce legislation honoring American Samoa's relationship with the United States;

...Last year, I wrote to the Commission which selects the subjects for commemorative postage stamps and the commission expressed interest in American Samoa's application. Working with Governor Sunia, we should have a commemorative stamp printed in time for our Flag Day celebration:

Finally, I have received commitments from the chairman and ranking member of the House Banking Committee that they will support legislation to mint 25 cent coins (quarters) with designs provided by the insular areas and the District of Columbia.
