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AMERICAN SAMOA WILL BENEFIT FROM ARMY RESERVE PLANS TO BUILD \$20 MILLION FACILITY IN TAFUNA

I am pleased that we have successfully completed negotiations with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) for a 6.5 acre site at the Tafuna Airport so the Army Reserve can construct a new training facility. The new facility, estimated to cost about \$20 million, will be necessary to meet the training demands resulting from the growth of the Army Reserve in American Samoa. It also would accommodate the USAR's future plans to expand operations in American Samoa by bringing additional units which will mean more job opportunities for our people.

The deal involved getting the FAA, which currently holds a lease on the said property from ASG, to release the land from Federal obligation and designate it for non-aeronautic purposes. After spending a considerable amount of time in back and forth negotiations, the FAA finally agreed. The FAA further agreed to extend a 55-year lease to the USAR. For its part, I was able to get the USAR to pay fair-market value for the property. All that is left is for ASG to submit a formal request to the FAA to release the property and then begin detailed negotiations with the USAR.

This is a win-win for everybody. Prior to this agreement, our government stood to lose Federal funding for the airport if ASG leased the land to USAR at a nominal lease rate. Now that the military has agreed to pay fair-market value, our airport will retain the right to the much needed Federal funding and will still receive fair-market value rates from the USAR. On the other side, the USAR will be able to construct its training facility to meet the needs of our troops.

I want to acknowledge the great help of Colonel Robert Lee, Commanding Officer of the U.S. Army's 9th Regional Support Com-

mand which includes American Samoa in the pursuit of this deal and also Senator Daniel Inouye (Fofogao Samoa). We worked on this project for the past five years.

It is estimated that the Army Reserve expends about \$3.5 million annually in American Samoa. With the addition of the new facility, the dollars expended by the Army in American Samoa will only increase and that is excellent news for our economy.

SAMOAN WOMAN APPOINTED TO WHITE HOUSE COMMISSION ON ASIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER AFFAIRS

I am very pleased that Ms. Jacinta Titiali'i Abbott, an American Samoan lawyer, has been appointed to the President's Advisory Commission on Asian and Pacific Islanders. She is one of three Pacific Islanders (Hawaiian, Guamanian and Samoan) on a commission of 15 members representing the diverse interests and ethnic groups among the Asian and Pacific Islander populations.

The Commission will function under the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) as authorized in an Executive Order issued by President Clinton last year establishing a White House initiative and an Advisory Commission on Asian and Pacific Islander Americans. The Commission will advise the President on the development, monitoring, and coordination of Federal efforts to

improve the quality of life of Asian and Pacific Islanders through increased participation in Federal programs and to collect data related to Asian and Pacific Islander populations. Efforts will include ways to increase public sector and community involvement in improving the health and well-being of Asian and Pacific Islanders and foster research and data on Asian and Pacific Islanders including research and data on public health.

Ms. Titiali'i's outstanding background as Vice President and Assistant General Counsel in one of the nations largest health care corporations and her understanding of the issues confronting our Samoan community and Pacific Islanders in general will serve her well in this very important commission.

AMERICAN SAMOA LOOKS FAVORABLE TO RECEIVE \$33.2 MILLION FROM THE FED FOR 2001

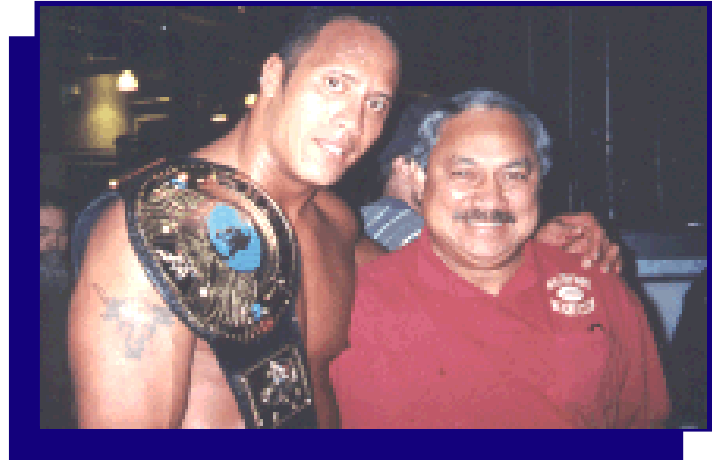
The House and Senate both have approved appropriations bills that will provide \$33.2 million for American Samoa for fiscal year 2001. The same amount was requested by the President in his budget proposal. The breakdown for this amount includes \$23.1 million for the operations of the American Samoa Government, and \$10.1 million for capital improvement projects or CIP. This is level funding with the past several years.

While I am very pleased with the progress our federal budget appropriation has made thus far, I am concerned by the threat posed by the strong language included in both the House and Senate bills over American Samoa's failure to resolve its outstanding debts. The House Appropriations Committee specifically noted that if the American Samoa Government does not take decisive action to control its costs and payroll, and enhance its revenues in accordance with previous recommendations, it will seriously consider reducing the next ASG operations budget. The Senate also has expressed concern.

American Samoa remains the only U.S. Territory to receive direct financial aid from the federal government to operate its government -- not as a reimbursement of taxes, or a supplement to cover foreign migration -- and I am glad that we will be able to continue both our operational funding as well as funding for our construction projects at the same rate as in previous years. The funds for construction projects should help address the large backlog of projects in this area.

As you may already know, I appeared before the Fono in

January and spoke in support of ASG using its benefits from the tobacco lawsuit to obtain an \$18.6 million cash advance. Of this amount, \$14 million could be used to pay off ASG debt, which could further help the local government work itself out of its current financial problems. That money is available as soon as ASG and the Department of Interior sign an MOU.

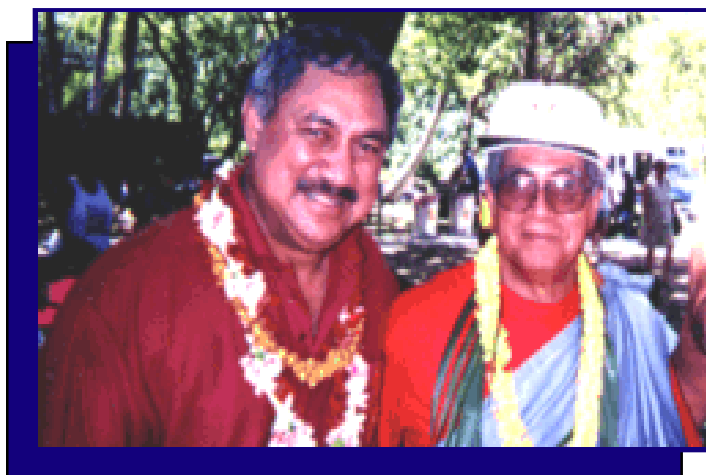

AMERICAN SAMOA ECONOMIC STUDY COMMISSION SEEKS OPINION OF THE PEOPLE

The American Samoa Economic Study Commission held a series of hearings in American Samoa to solicit input from the public on ways to improve American Samoa's economic situation. This is the first time a Commission was established to focus mainly on the economy of American Samoa. The Commission will recommend to the Federal government sound economic policy that will cause sustainable economic self-sufficiency for American Samoa. The Commission also met with Prime Minister Tuilaepa Malielegaoi of Samoa (Western) to discuss areas of mutual interest between both governments that hold potential for economic development.

A local Task Force organized under the American Samoa Community College provided an invaluable service and assistance to the efforts of the Commission. The Task Force conducted meetings that were designed to bring together the concerns and ideas of the community to formulate strategies that will improve economic development. I commend the members of the Task Force which include Dr. Carol Whittaker, Fa Achica, Vena Sele, Dr. Trudie Sala, Danny Aga, Adele Moaaliitele and Al Ripine for the fine work they did in soliciting the opinions from the public on this important matter. The private sector and the Fono also had the opportunity to address their concerns regarding businesses in American Samoa.

The participation of the people of American Samoa is essential because they have the most at stake and are the ones who must assume the leadership role in implementing any economic plan. The hearings were very successful in that the Commission heard a

ASG WILL SOON BEGIN TO PAY DOWN DEBT

I am pleased that the Fono supported the federal legislation which I pushed in Congress and eventually was passed by the U.S. Congress authorizing American Samoa to loan \$18.6 million from the federal government while using its share from the tobacco settlement as security. The legislation was initiated after I received a letter from Governor Tauese Sunia requesting that I look into the possibility of obtaining such a deal.

As it was approved, the federal legislation provided American Samoa the option to borrow this money. The Fono later enacted local legislation to that effect and the Governor signed it into law.

I want to specifically thank the leadership of the Fono, both in the Senate and the House, and all of the Fono members for passing the needed legislation. I also thank Governor Sunia for his efforts in support of this matter, and especially for signing the bill into law.

I truly believe that under the gloomy financial situation our government has been facing for sometime, this loan can relieve much of the burden and allow the Governor to reorganize and streamline government operations in a more manageable way.
