

SHORELINE CHANGES IN THE TIMBALIER BARRIER ISLAND ARC: 1887 - 1996

Terrebonne and Lafourche Parishes, Louisiana

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INTRODUCTION

The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), in cooperation with the Coastal Research Laboratory in the Department of Geology and Geophysics at Louisiana State University (LSU), is presenting the results of a study of shoreline changes in the Terrebonne and Lafourche Parishes, Louisiana, from 1887 to 1996. The study area includes the Timbalier Islands, a series of barrier islands extending from the mouth of the Gulf of Mexico to the east of the Terrebonne and Lafourche Parishes. The study area is located in the northern part of the Louisiana coast, between the mouths of the Atchafalaya and the Bayou du Large rivers.

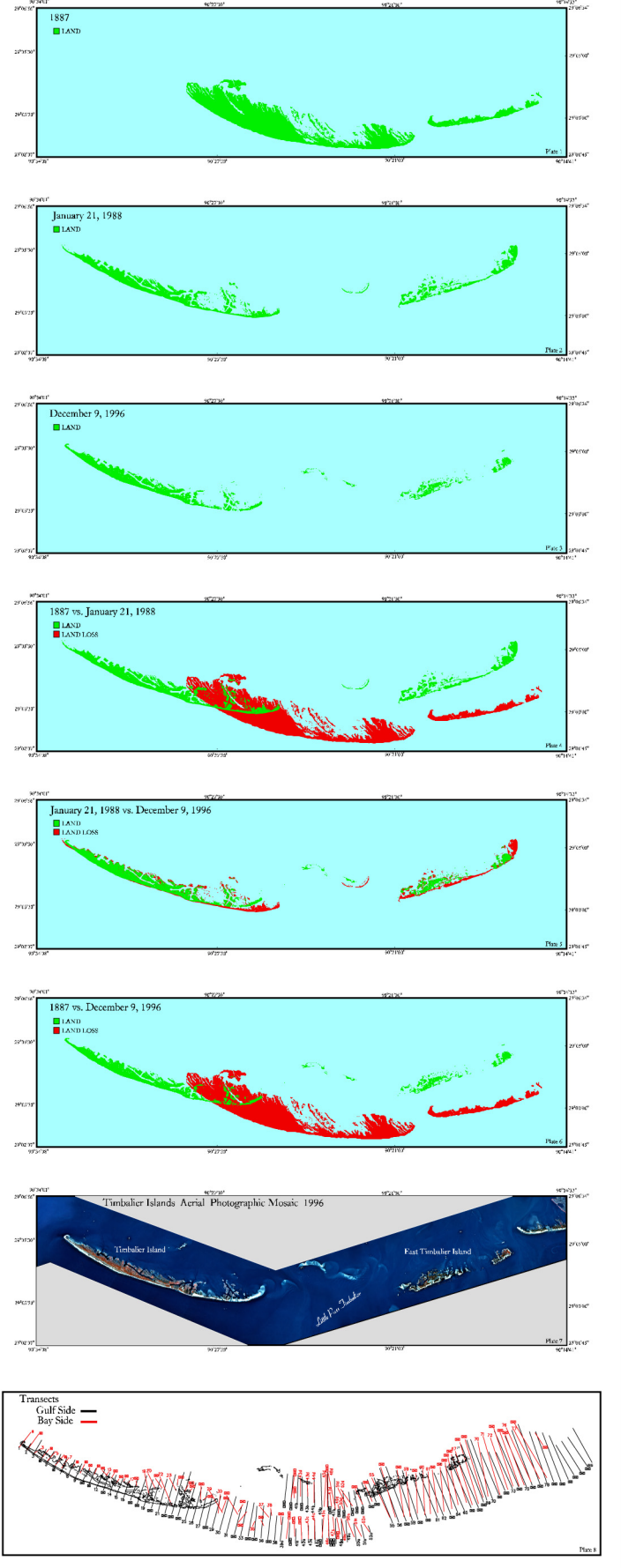


Figure 1. The Timbalier barrier island arc located 100 km northeast of New Orleans.

The Timbalier Islands are located about 100 km northeast of New Orleans (Figure 1). The barrier islands consist of 10 long and narrow islands that extend from the mouth of the Atchafalaya River to the east of the Terrebonne and Lafourche Parishes. The islands are located in the northern part of the Louisiana coast, between the mouths of the Atchafalaya and the Bayou du Large rivers.
