

• Part A. Common Information

Part B. Individual Engine Family Application

- 1. Request for Certification
- 2. Correspondence and Communications
- 3. Certification Summary information (CSI)
- 4. Application Requirements (40 CFR §86.416-80)
- 5. Averaging and Banking Requirements, if Any
- 6. Additional California Requirements (Reserved)

Part B. Individual Engine Family Application Section 1. Request for Certification:

Information to be Included:

- Manufacturer's legal name
- Name of the engine family and its vehicle category
- Compliance statements
- Primary certification contact information
- Signature of an authorized company representative.

Advice for Submittal:

- Cover letter format
- Identify primary contact by "For questions call..."

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Part B. Individual Engine Family Application Section 2. Correspondence and Communications

Information to be Included:

- Information for all persons authorized to be in contact with EPA/CARB
- One primary company email address for receiving official documents.
- ➢ U.S. mail address
- Dedicated Email address

Advice for Submittal:

- Supply complete contacts list in Part A.
- Create an email address: <u>certificate@company.com</u>, or

Company-cert@xxx.com

to receive EPA/CARB documents.

Part B. Individual Engine Family Application Section 3. Certification Summary Information (CSI)

• CSI is a summary of the certification information for a specific EF

• CSI is comprised of 7 sections.

- 1. General Information
- 2. EPA/CARB Emission Standards and Certification Levels
- 3. Engine Family Description
- 4. Exhaust Emission Control Information
- 5. Exhaust Emission Data Vehicle and Test Data
- 6. Permeation Emissions Control and Test Data
- 7. Models Covered

Part B. Section 4 (a): Engine Family Description

Information to be Included:

- Engine family name
- Vehicle categories
- Any new technology applied
- Fuel type
- EF specifications
- Models covered

Advice for Submittal:

 Refer to appropriate sections on the CSI for required information

Part B. Section 4 (b): Emission Data Vehicle (EDV) Description

Information to be Included:

- Explanation for EDV selection
- EDV specifications
- Test related information

Advice for Submittal:

 Refer to appropriate sections on CSI for the required information

Part B. Section 4 (c):

Vehicle Emission Control Information (VECI) Label

Information to be Included:

 As specified in 40 CFR §86.413-78

- Discuss with EPA/CARB in advance if you propose any changes other than specified in §86.413-78
- Present copy of VECI label in the same size as actual label
- You may reference a complete set of copies of the labels for a model year in Part A

Part B. Section 4 (d):

Emission Control Systems and Auxiliary Emission Control Devices

Information to be Included:

- Exhaust emission controls
- Evaporative/permeable emission controls
- AECD information

Advice for Submittal:

- Refer to the CSI for the required information, when applicable
- Use schematics, tables and lists
- Place common information in Part A

For CBI:

- make a CBI file and a public file:
 - CBI_EF name.pdf
 - FOI_EF name.pdf
- create a CBI code in public file and describe the code in the CBI file
- both files must be submitted concurrently

Part B. Section 4 (e):

Adjustable Operating Parameters and Other Adjustments

Information to be Included:

 As specified in 40 CFR §86.416-80 and §86.409-78

Advice for Submittal:

 Organize the required information by a table (example provided)

Part B. Section 4 (f): Projected U.S./California Sales

Information to be Included:

 Projected total US sales and CA-only sales for each model of the engine family

Advice for Submittal:

 For confidential treatment, submit the table in the CBI file

Part B. Section 4 (g):

Test Equipment, Fuel, and Engine Lubricant

Information to be Included:

- Description of all EPA/CARB approved...
 - > Special or alternate test procedures
 - Special test equipment
 - Durability procedures or driving schedules
 - Permeation tests
 - Evaportaive whole vehicle tests
- Lists of test fuel specifications for exhaust, permeation, and evap emissions

- Include a copy of EPA/CARB's approvals
- Reference the approval number
- List the test fuel specifications for exhaust, permeation, and evaporative emissions side-by-side with the required range as specified in the regulations

Part B. Section 4 (h): Proposed Service Accumulation Procedure

Information to be Included:

- If you are not using the Durability driving schedule specified in appendix IV of part 86 for service accumulation, provide a description of the alternate procedure you plan to use
- Maintenance instructions
- DF data type (new, carryover, or carry-across)
- Description of durability process

- Provide the durability procedure descriptions in Part A and place a reference in this section
- Reference appropriate Sections on CSI for DF and test results
- If new durability data is not provided, explain the reason and identify the source of data
- Provide durability data and info in table format

Part B. Section 4 (i): Statement of Recommended Periodic and Anticipated Maintenance and Procedures

Information to be Included:

- Listings of fuels and lubricants recommended to ultimate purchaser
- Description of program for training of personnel for maintenance
- Description of equipment required to perform maintenance
- Critical emission-related maintenance
- Recommended additional maintenance
- Special maintenance
- Non-critical emission-related maintenance
- Maintenance that is not emission-related
- Emission related part number summary form and sources for parts and repairs

- Make a table to list all parts that are emission related, with sources for parts and repairs
- Provide owners manual

Part B. Section 4 (j):

Normal Assembly Line Operation and Adjustments

Information to be Included:

Provide a description of normal assembly line operation and adjustments if such procedures exceed 100 km (62 miles) or three hours of operation

Part B. Section 4 (k): Evaporative/Permeation Emission Controls

Information to be Included:

- Permeation family or group name
- Evap family or group name
- ► Fuel tank:
 - Material
 - ► Wall thickness
 - Total inside surface area
 - Treatment approach/control technology
- **Fuel line:**
 - Material
 - Wall thickness
 - Total inside surface area
 - Control technology
- Other

Advice for Submittal:

- You may reference the appropriate CSI sections for the required information
- Use schematics
- Provide durability procedure descriptions in Part A

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Part B. Section 5: Averaging and Early Banking Requirements

Information to be Included:

- Compliance statements for AB
- Detailed AB calculations

Advice for Submittal:

- Use table format to organize data, sample provided
- Place the AB form in Part A
- For confidential treatment, submit both CBI file and public file

CARB:

no banking and trading use CA-only sales for averaging require a separate CARB averaging compliance plan
