

Comparison Between Miami-Dade County, Florida Students and U.S. Students 2007 YRBS

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) monitors priority health risk behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death, disability, and social problems among youth and adults in the United States. The national YRBS is conducted every two years during the spring semester and provides data representative of 9th through 12th grade students in public and private schools throughout the United States. The Miami-Dade County, Florida YRBS also is conducted every 2 years and provides data representative of 9th through 12th grade students in public schools throughout Miami-Dade County, Florida.
