In 2007 the New Mexico Department of Transportation expended approximately \$43,000 for contracted night time sweeping operations, \$200,000 for weed and litter pickup, and \$100,000 for contracted culvert cleaning in the Las Cruces Metropolitan Area.

In addition, approximately \$150,000 was expended by the District Office of the Department of Transportation for in-house erosion control activities, including the construction of numerous major erosion control/bank stabilization projects.

The NMDOT also continues to participate in the "Rio the Duck/Storm Water Team" partnership with numerous other agencies to practice and promote public outreach and education through varios media outlets to include major television ads.

The District One Maintenance Section consistently looks for ways to improve operations and is currently utilizing existing contracts for litter pick-up operations through partnerships with the Dona Ana County Judicial system to utilize corrections inmate workers during the work week on state roadways.
