MAN CHARGED WITH POSSESSING A MACHINE GUN AND COUNTERFEIT CURRENCY

PRESS RELEASE

Susan W. Brooks, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that DAVID B. TAYLOR, 28, of Princeton, Kentucky, was indicted by a federal grand jury sitting in Indianapolis for possession of a firearm by a felon, possession of a machine gun, and possession of counterfeit currency, following an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives and the U.S. Secret Service.

The three-count Indictment alleges that on January 19, 2007, in Perry County, Indiana, TAYLOR possessed a firearm after he had sustained multiple felony convictions in Kentucky. The indictment also alleges that the firearm TAYLOR possessed was a machine gun. Finally, the indictment alleges that TAYLOR was in possession of counterfeit United States currency.

According to Assistant U. S. Attorney Todd S. Shellenbarger, who is prosecuting the case for the government, TAYLOR faces a maximum possible prison sentence of 20 years and a maximum possible fine of \$250,000. An initial hearing will be scheduled before a U.S. Magistrate Judge in Evansville.

The Indictment is an allegation only, and the defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty at trial or by guilty plea.
