INDIANAPOLIS WOMAN SENTENCED TO PRISON FOR THEFT OF MAIL AND BANK FRAUD

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, Acting United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that BONITA M. PACK, 46, Indianapolis, Indiana, was sentenced to 66 months imprisonment yesterday by U.S. District Judge Sarah Evans Barker following her guilty plea to bank fraud and theft of mail. This case was the result of a year-long investigation by the U.S. Postal Inspection Service.

PACK used stolen mail to obtain bank account information, which was then used to make fraudulent cash withdrawals at various banks on those victim's banking accounts. PACK was apprehended in Marion County, Indiana following a call by a victim of one of the mail thefts, stating that PACK had stolen her mail and was using the victim's stolen credit card to pay for a satellite television at PACK's home.

According to Assistant U.S. Attorney Doris L. Pryor, who prosecuted the case for the government, Judge Barker also imposed 3 years supervised release following PACK's release from imprisonment. During the period of supervised release, PACK must get drug treatment. PACK was ordered to make restitution in the amount of \$25,771.54.
