PRISONER SENTENCED FOR ESCAPE

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, Acting United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that ANTHONY WARE, 37, Saginaw, Michigan, was sentenced to 21 months imprisonment today by U.S. District Judge John Daniel Tinder following his guilty plea to escape from the Federal Prison Camp. This case was the result of an investigation by the United States Marshal Service and the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

On October 12, 2001, it was determined that an inmate was missing from the Terre Haute Federal Prison Camp. A bed count indicated that WARE was the missing inmate, and he was placed on escape status. WARE was arrested on criminal charges in Connecticut in 2006 and was transferred to Terre Haute to face this charge.

According to Assistant U.S. Attorney James M. Warden, who prosecuted the case for the government, Judge Tinder also imposed 3 years supervised release following WARE's release from imprisonment.
