BANK EMPLOYEE SENTENCED TO PRISON FOR EMBEZZLEMENT

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, Acting United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that STELLA L. HENRY, 65, Charlestown, Indiana, was sentenced to 21 months imprisonment late Friday by U.S. District Judge John Daniel Tinder following her guilty plea to Bank Embezzlement. This case was the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

HENRY was an employee of JP Morgan Chase Bank, in Charlestown, Indiana. Between February 4, 2002 and October 15, 2005, she embezzled \$156,612.48 of the bank's money by manipulation of customer accounts.

According to Assistant U.S. Attorney James M. Warden, who prosecuted the case for the government, Judge Tinder also imposed 5 years supervised release following HENRY's release from imprisonment. HENRY was ordered to make restitution of the full amount of the loss.
