TWO FEDERAL INMATES INDICTED FOR POSSESSION OF CONTRABAND

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, Acting United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that ANTHONY P. PETERS, 29, and TITUS B. WEBSTER, 42, both inmates at the Federal Correctional Complex, Terre Haute, IN, were indicted separately by a federal grand jury sitting in Indianapolis for Possession of Contraband in Prison, following investigations by the Bureau of Prisons.

The indictment against PETERS alleges that on October 23, 2007, PETERS possessed marijuana while confined at the Federal Correctional Complex. The indictment against WEBSTER alleges that on October 19, 2007, WEBSTER possessed a metal object designed to be used as a weapon while confined at the Federal Correctional Complex.

According to Assistant United States Attorney James M. Warden, who is prosecuting the case for the government, both PETERS and WEBSTER face a maximum possible prison sentence of 5 years and a maximum possible fine of \$250,000. Initial hearings will be scheduled before a U.S. Magistrate Judge in Terre Haute, Indiana.

The indictments are allegations only, and the defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty at trial or by guilty plea.
