MAN SENTENCED FOR MAIL FRAUD SCHEME

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that ROBBIN J. RIEMKE, 46, of Lafayette, Indiana, was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment by U.S. District Judge Richard L. Young following his guilty plea to mail fraud. This case was the result of a investigation by the U.S. Postal Inspection Service.

RIEMKE was employed as a site manager for Aramark at the Ford Motor Company facility in Princeton, Indiana at the time of the offense. Between 2003 and 2005, RIEMKE submitted false invoices to his employer using the U.S. mail. These invoices, which RIEMKE certified as valid, resulted in a business entity that RIEMKE controlled receiving \$53,966 for work allegedly done at the Ford facility.

According to Assistant U.S. Attorney Todd S. Shellenbarger, who prosecuted the case for the government, Judge Young also imposed 3 years supervised release following RIEMKE's release from imprisonment. During the period of supervised release, RIEMKE must make restitution in the amount of \$53,966.
