# South Asia – Earthquake

# BACKGROUND

- A magnitude 7.6 earthquake struck Pakistan, India, and Afghanistan on October 8, 2005, at 0850 local time, according to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS). The epicenter of the earthquake was located near Muzaffarabad, the capital of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) and approximately 60 miles north-northeast of Islamabad.
- Aftershocks continue in the affected areas. The delivery of humanitarian assistance is constricted by the mountainous area, cold weather, and damaged or collapsed infrastructure. The most affected areas are the Northwest Frontier Province (NWFP), Northern Punjab, and AJK in Pakistan, and Indian-administered Kashmir in India.

### **CURRENT SITUATION**

- Relief flights resumed on January 18 across most earthquake-affected areas following rain and snow storms that began on January 14 and disrupted relief operations. According to the USAID Disaster Assistance Response Team (USAID/DART), extensive preparation for winter weather and ongoing humanitarian interventions in AJK and NWFP are minimizing the negative impact of the weather on earthquake-affected populations. Since the start of USAID's emergency relief operation, USAID-funded partners have been preparing for inclement weather and working around the clock to preposition and deliver relief supplies to the hardest hit areas. On January 19, the USAID/DART met with nine implementing partners to discuss the progress of the relief effort. The USAID/DART remains in close contact with non-governmental organizations (NGOs), the GOP, and U.N. agencies to monitor how changes in the weather affect the humanitarian relief efforts
- The USAID/DART Shelter and Settlements Advisor (SSA) is providing technical assistance to meet emergency shelter needs. Working with the humanitarian community in Muzaffarabad, the USAID/DART SSA is focusing on needs specific to urban areas. As part of the planning process for the transition from emergency to permanent shelter, on January 19, the USAID/DART SSA attended a meeting of the strategic working group for housing reconstruction. The working group drafted a paper entitled "Transitional Shelter and Return" to serve as the basis for the reconstruction of housing in earthquake-affected areas.
- Between January 13 and 16, the USAID/DART Water and Sanitation Officer (WSO) met with several implementing partners working in Mansehra and Batagram, NWFP, and visited water and sanitation projects in the region, including the installation of new piping in Peshora Village and the construction of latrines and washrooms in Baribanda Village in the Siran Valley. To enhance collaboration among NGOs in the field and improve timely access to current information, the USAID/DART is assisting partners with reporting assessments and project results to the water and sanitation cluster.
- The USAID/DART Livelihoods Officer reported that affected families have used GOP compensation payments for health
  care costs and to replace household items and livestock lost in the earthquake. To support the restoration of livelihoods
  and income generation, USAID/DART partners are managing cash-for-work programs to level fields, clear roads, salvage
  construction materials, clear shelter sites, construct latrines, repair terraces, reconstruct grinding mills, transport shelter
  material, restore water supplies, improve hygiene, and monitor safe play areas for children.

• On January 16 and 17, U.N. Special Envoy for the South Asia Earthquake, Former President George H. W. Bush, traveled to Pakistan, where he met with President Pervez Musharraf and stressed the need for ongoing donor commitment to the relief operation. Former President Bush visited a tent village in Islamabad housing approximately 30,000 earthquake survivors and toured a USAID-supported school in which approximately 2,000 children are currently enrolled.

#### USG HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

Pakistan

- At the Donors Conference on Rehabilitation and Reconstruction of Earthquake Affected Areas in Islamabad on November 19, former USAID Administrator Andrew S. Natsios announced an increase in the overall U.S. commitment to Pakistan for relief and reconstruction to a total of \$510 million. This pledge includes \$300 million in economic assistance from the USG, \$110 million in U.S. military in-kind support for relief operations, and more than \$100 million anticipated from U.S. private contributions.
- To date, USAID has provided more than \$67.1 million in humanitarian assistance to earthquake-affected communities in Pakistan. USAID identified shelter, relief supplies, logistics, health, water and sanitation, and livelihoods support as priority sectors for relief operations.
- To date, USAID has provided nearly \$6.4 million in emergency relief commodities, including transport costs, for earthquake-affected populations in Pakistan. USAID has completed 25 flights of emergency relief commodities to Pakistan. The flights delivered a total of 97,725 blankets, 1,570 winterized tents, 8,050 rolls of plastic sheeting for approximately 36,672 families, 15,000 water containers, 17 water bladders, 2 water purification units, 10 U.N. World Health Organization (WHO) emergency health kits, 20 concrete cutting saws, and 136 shelters donated by Alaska Shelters.
- In response to the U.N. South Asia Earthquake Flash Appeal, USAID has provided more than \$22.6 million in funding to support transitional shelter programs, food, health, water and sanitation, humanitarian air service, logistical coordination, and the transport of supplies to affected populations and movement of those populations to safe areas.
- On October 27, President George W. Bush established the South Asia Earthquake Relief Fund (SAERF) headed by five private-sector chief executive officers (CEOs) to spearhead private fundraising efforts for relief and reconstruction in the aftermath of the South Asia earthquake. To date, the SAERF has collected approximately \$16 million in cash and in-kind contributions for the South Asia earthquake relief efforts.
- The USAID/DART has been on the ground in Pakistan since October 10. The mission of the USAID/DART is to assess humanitarian needs, assist with targeting and coordination of USG assistance in conjunction with USAID/Pakistan, and provide technical support as needed. Headquartered in Islamabad, the USAID/DART has also established bases of operations in Muzaffarabad and Mansehra.
- In addition to the provision of sheets of tarpaulin, blankets, and winterized and non-winterized tents in support of the overall shelter strategy, USAID funded nine NGO partners to provide shelter assistance to approximately 75,500 households.
- To date, USAID's Office of Food for Peace (FFP) has responded to the U.N. World Food Program (WFP) emergency operation for Pakistan with 4,990 MT of vegetable oil and 480 MT of wheat soy blend. The total value of this contribution is approximately \$6.7 million.
- As of January 20, the U.S. Department of State's Bureau for Population, Refugees, and Migration (State/PRM) has contributed \$4 million to the Office of the U.N. High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) to support activities identified in the 2005 U.N. South Asia Earthquake Flash Appeal. Specific activities include the establishment and management of camps and spontaneous settlements for earthquake-affected populations and the provision of essential relief supplies such as tents, blankets, and stoves to camp residents.
- As of January 20, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has provided 46,000 MT of wheat, valued at \$12 million, to the GOP. This wheat will be distributed to food-insecure families lacking the financial means to purchase food.
- On October 20, USAID and Procter & Gamble announced a \$600,000 public-private alliance to provide safe drinking water for those affected by the earthquake. Through this partnership, USAID and Proctor & Gamble are supplying a point-of-use water purification product that significantly reduces diarrheal illnesses. Through the Global Development Alliance (GDA), USAID contributed \$300,000 toward this partnership, which provides safe drinking water to more than 50,000 households for 3 months.
- As of January 18, the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) has flown 3,359 helicopter missions, delivered 8,797 short tons of humanitarian relief supplies, and evacuated casualties and transported humanitarian relief workers for a total of 18,442 passengers. The 212th Mobile Army Surgical Hospital (MASH), established on October 25 in Muzaffarabad, and a 3rd Marine Expeditionary Force medical element, established on November 16 in Shinkiari, have performed more than 433 surgeries and treated more than 23,161 non-surgical patients. To date, DOD has obligated \$103 million for relief operations.

#### India

- From October 11 to 17, a USAID/OFDA Regional Advisor was in India assisting USAID/India with damage and needs assessments and making recommendations regarding USG assistance. The USAID/OFDA Regional Advisor and a representative from USAID/India conducted a post-earthquake visit to Srinagar in Jammu and Kashmir on November 15 and 16 in order to monitor program progress of USAID/OFDA-funded partners.
- On October 10, U.S. Ambassador to India David C. Mulford issued a disaster declaration due to the effects of the October 8 earthquake in northern India. As of November 1, USAID has provided more than \$600,000 to relief organizations for emergency relief supplies and shelter.
- The Government of India did not request international assistance.
