Dear Mr. Di Sanzo,

This is in response to your December 17, 1995, petition for GC/FTIR test equivalency for measuring oxygenates, benzene and total aromatics in gasolines.

EPA has decided to undertake a rulemaking that would ultimately establish a performance based test method approach for the measurement of the reformulated gasoline (RFG) parameters at CFR 80.46. We envision that this rulemaking would provide flexibility to the regulated industry in their choice of test methods to be utilized under the RFG and conventional gasoline programs without having to petition the Agency for their utilization if the test method differs from the Federal test method. We expect to finalize this rulemaking by September 1, 1998.

In the meantime, in an effort to provide flexibility until the above mentioned rule is promulgated, EPA plans to expeditiously initiate a rulemaking that would extend the deadline for the use of alternative test procedures for aromatics and oxygenates at §80.46 until September 1, 1998. EPA hopes to complete this rulemaking to extend the deadline before the end of 1996.
