## ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR OCCUPANCY & USE OF THE LAKE SUPERIOR SHORELINE OF THE SAULT STE. MARIE RANGER DISTRICT ON THE HIAWATHA NATIONAL FOREST

Under the authority of the Act of Congress of June 4, 1897, as amended (16 USC 551), and the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations 36 CFR 261.50(a) and or (b), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on all lands of the Hiawatha National Forest, located between the Lake Superior Shoreline at Whitefish Bay and Lakeshore Drive.

1. Camping, unless at Developed Recreation Areas designated for such use. 36 CFR 261.58(e)

This order applies to approximately 20 miles of beach and adjacent lands, administered by the U. S. Forest Service, within Sections of Township 47 North, Ranges 3, 4, 5, and 6 West, located north of Forest Highway 42, within Chippewa County, Michigan - as shown on the attached map.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons will be exempt from the order:

- Any Federal, State, or Local officers, or members of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 2 Persons with a valid permit in their possession signed by the District Ranger or Forest Supervisor specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 3. Individuals identified as exempt in other agreements or (MOU's) Memorandum of Understanding.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 and imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both under the authority of Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3559 and 3571.
