Swells that developed over the Gulf of Mexico in association with a tight surface pressure gradient between Tropical Storm Stan and high pressure located over the eastern United States, arrived on the coastlines of South Padre Island. These swells produce heavy surf, dangerous rip currents, and minor tidal overflow. Minor damage to sand dunes was reported.
