As General Counsel for the U.S. Government Printing Office, Nicholas Lefevre is the chief legal officer for the agency. In that capacity, he provides legal opinions and advice to the Public Printer, and represents the GPO in all legal matters involving Government and non-Government organizations. In addition to providing legal opinions and advice for the agency, the Office of the General Counsel represents GPO before all Federal administrative forums, including the Merit Systems Protection Board, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, and the GAO Board of Contract Appeals.

Biography

Lefevre arrived at GPO in 2008, after being a leading lawyer in the digital technology field for nearly 30 years. He has spent the majority of his career as an attorney-advisor to senior management at computer, software, publishing and technology companies. Lefevre is an expert in the copyright field, having been part of the transition from paper to desktop publishing to internet and digital rights management. Prior to coming to GPO, Lefevre spent more than two decades in California in private practice and as chief in-house counsel to digital technology companies: Commodore Business Machines, Atari Corporation, Konami Digital Entertainment and VM Labs, Inc. He served as a law clerk for two years at the U.S. Court of Claims (now the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit).

Lefevre is a graduate of Georgetown University Law Center. He received his Bachelor's Degree from American University. Lefevre is currently a member of the California Bar Association.
