STOP AQUATIC HITCHHIKERS

Aquatic nuisance species pose a serious threat to the recreational and natural resources of Lake Tahoe.







Aquatic weeds and invasive mussels spread by hitchhiking on boats, trailers and equipment





Why Should I Care?

- EURASIAN WATERMILFOIL and CURLYLEAF PONDWEED grow in thick mats in marinas, clogging motors and making swimming dangerous.
- Second Plant fragments left on boats can regenerate into new plants.
- ZEBRA/QUAGGA MUSSELS increase drag on the hull, jam steerage, and clog intake pipes. They are the size of a fingernail and larvae are invisible in bilge water.
- ZEBRA/QUAGGA MUSSELS can survive thirty days out
 of water in the Tahoe Basin due to low humidity.



Check all of these places for hitchhikers:



Stop the spread! Clean. Drain. Dry.

- ✓ CLEAN the hull with pressurized water, removing all dirt, plant and animal material from your boat motor, live wells, trailer, anchors, fishing gear and dive gear.
- ✓ DISPOSE of foreign matter above the waterline on dry land or in a trash can.
- ☑ DRAIN the water from your boat motor, live well and bilge on land before you leave the immediate area.
- ✓ FLUSH the boat, motor and bilges with hot water.



Quagga mussels have been found in CA and NV. Don't let them come to Lake Tahoe!
