# **The Migrant Student Records Exchange Initiative & MSIX** The Basics



## The Need for Records Exchange

- Highly mobile migrant student population
- Students move from State to State often without notice
- Timely and accurate educational and health information not always available
- Students placed in incorrect courses or grades
- Students not provided most beneficial MEP services



## Migrant Records Exchange Today

- States use disparate migrant student databases to maintain information on migrant students
- Some States that use the same migrant student database have a limited ability to electronically exchange records among each other
- Many States still exchange records via fax or regular mail
- States need an electronic system to exchange migrant student records on a national basis



## The Records Exchange Initiative has 4 goals

- Goal 1: Create an electronic exchange for the transfer of migrant student education and health data amongst the States
- Goal 2: Promote the use of the Migrant Student Information Exchange (MSIX)
- Goal 3: Ensure the use of the consolidated migrant student record for the purposes of enrollment, placement and accrual of credits of migrant students
- Goal 4: Produce national data on the migrant population



## What is MSIX?

MSIX is a web-based portal that will link States' migrant student record databases to facilitate the national exchange of migrant students' educational and health information among the States





## What MSIX does...

- MSIX produces a single "consolidated record" for each migrant child that contains information from each State in which the child was ever enrolled
- MSIX contains the minimum data elements necessary for the proper enrollment, grade and course placement, and accrual of credits for migrant children

## What MSIX does not do...

 MSIX does not replace existing migrant student information systems




## **State Responsibilities**

- Collect and maintain the minimum data elements
- Transmit data to MSIX in a timely manner
- Determine who will have access to MSIX in your State
- Assign staff who will resolve questions about students from your State
- Instruct State and local staff on the proper use of the MSIX consolidated record for enrollment, placement and accrual of credits for migrant students
- Ensure proper and secure use of MSIX by State and local staff





# MSIX will consolidate and provide access to migrant student records from state systems






## **Key MSIX Features**


- Create users based on 'MSIX roles' to allow appropriate access to MSIX functions and student data
- Create regions within states to manage MSIX activities and workflow
- Retrieve and view student information
  - Search, view and print consolidated student records
  - Multiple search parameters
  - Accessible online
  - Printed reports available
- Identify and resolve student record conflicts
  - Student Merge workflow
  - Student Split workflow
- Notify other jurisdictions of planned student moves






# **MSIX Security**






# MSIX uses various levels of security to manage overall risk to data within the application

- MSIX leverages secure technologies (e.g., HTTPS, sFTP) to control access
- MSIX uses roles to limit user access to features using a needto-know approach
- Users must review and agree to the MSIX Rules of Behavior, which includes details behind
  - Application Monitoring (types of monitoring used for/by MSIX)
  - MSIX Security Controls (access control, communications)
  - User Credentials (login, passwords)
  - Protecting MSIX Information (login/logout, paper reports, sensitive data)

- MSIX training
- MSIX National Roll-out

## November - December 2007

- Live NGS data uploaded to MSIX
- Texas MSIX live data pilot with ESCs

## January - May 2007

Texas MSIX live data pilot with LEAs

#### June 2007

- MSIX full implementation
- MSIX Guidelines



## **Proposed MSIX Training and Passwords**


## Training Process

- On-line training through MSIX
- Trainings to be offered through TETN, NCLB Coordinated Meetings, etc

## Passwords Issuance and Maintenance

- Passwords issued through TEA
- Password Request form similar to NGS Oath form
- MSIX access to follow same process as NGS with levels of access
