The Friends of the Jordan River National Fish Hatchery were a recipient of a Challenge Cost Share grant which funded the construction of a Visitors Pavilion on the hatchery grounds. In addition to securing funding, the Friends Group held a "Barn Raising" event to complete construction of the structure.

The Friends of the Jordan River National Fish Hatchery is vital to the educational and public awareness programs carried out at Jordan River National Fish Hatchery. The organization sponsors: "Fish are Fun" an after school and evening program series, where children are provided opportunities to learn about our environment, natural resource conservation and Michigan fishes. The spring "Adopt a Trail Cleanup" is completed on "Earth Day." The annual event is performed in coordination with partners from the North Country Trail Association and Boy Scouts of America. The Friends Group assists in the promotion and support of numerous other hatchery events.

Established in 1963 in the picturesque Jordan River valley of northern Lower Michigan, the **Jordan River National Fish Hatchery** is dedicated to the production of lake trout for restoration purposes in the Great Lakes. Largest of three regional Fish and Wildlife Service facilities dedicated to the production of lake trout for stocking, the hatchery annually produces over three million fingerling and yearling lake trout for distribution in lakes Michigan and Huron.
