General Hunting Regulations

All Minnesota State regulations pertaining to hunting and trapping will be enforced. You may only hunt and trap in the areas specified in this brochure during open state seasons. Each activity may be subject to refuge specific regulations.

For authorized hunting, refuge is open two hours before legal shooting time to one hour after legal shooting time.

Some areas have been posted in the field to protect buildings, private property or critical habitat areas. Please respect any signed area you encounter in the field.

The possession of alcohol while hunting is prohibited.

Gas or electric boat motors are prohibited on the refuge.

It is unlawful to drive a metal object into a tree or to hunt from a tree in which a metal object has been driven. Screw-in steps are prohibited.

All items, including boats, must be removed at the end of the day.

All stands must be removed from the refuge at the end of each day. It is unlawful to hunt from a permanent stand.

The distribution of bait and hunting over bait, including salt licks, mineral blocks or any chemical substance applied to the ground or vegetation is prohibited on National Wildlife Refuge Units.

No motorized vehicles are allowed within the hunting units except at designated parking areas.

No hunting on, across or within 50 feet of any road, parking lot or marked trail.

Target shooting is prohibited.

The use or possession of center fire rifles, pistols or air guns is prohibited on the refuge.

Waterfowl Hunting will be held in accordance with all state and federal hunting regulations and seasons.

Rapids Lake Unit

The entire unit is open to the following:

- n Deer Hunting
 Bow and Arrow Hunting
 Shotgun
 Muzzleloading
- n Waterfowl Hunting
- n Small Game Hunting Restricted to 22 caliber rimfire only or shotguns utilizing non-toxic ammunition.
- n Turkey Hunting
 Open for both fall and spring state
 turkey seasons. A Minnesota state
 turkey permit is required. Only shotguns with non-toxic shot or bow and
 arrows may be used. Only
 non-toxic shot may be possessed.

Louisville Swamp Unit (North of Middle Road)

n Deer Hunting
Bow and Arrow Hunting ONLY.

(South of Middle Road)

- n Deer Hunting Bow and Arrow Hunting ONLY.
- n Waterfowl Hunting
- n Small Game Hunting
 Only non-toxic shot may be used or possessed.
- possessed.
 Single projectiles are prohibited.
 Open to all state seasons with the exception that furbearers and crows MAY NOT be harvested.
- MAY NOT be harvested.

 n Turkey Hunting
 Open for both fall and spring state
 turkey seasons. A Minnesota state
 turkey permit is required.
 Only shotguns with non-toxic shot or
 bow and arrows may be used. Only
 non-toxic shot may be possessed.

Wilkie Unit

- n Deer Hunting Allowed west of Eagle Creek Bow and Arrow Hunting ONLY.
- n Waterfowl Hunting
 Waterfowl hunting is restricted to
 the Rice Lake area which is defined
 as the area East of old Hwy 18 and
 Hwy 169 West of Eagle Creek and
 South of the Minnesota River and
 North of Hwy 13.

No Small Game or Turkey Hunting will be allowed on this unit.

Trapping

Various refuge units are open to qualified trappers with a refuge permit.

All trappers must attend a mandatory orientation session to receive a permit.

Trapping on the refuge is limited to muskrat, beaver, racoon, and mink.

Special Note

Other areas of the refuge may be hunted with a special refuge permit by people with disabilities or participants of the Young Waterfowlers Program.

Getting There

Rapids Lake Unit

DNR and Refuge land south of the Carver Bluffs development, mostly east of Co. Rd. 45, west of the Minnesota River, and downstream from the Co. Rd. 9 bridge near Jordan.

From the Twin Cities, exit HWY 212 P1 on Co. Rd. 40 to Carver. From the Carver Village Hall near the center of town, continue driving on Co. Rd. 40 south from town 2.2 miles to Co. Rd. 45. Turn left. Drive .8 miles to P1 on your left.

As for P1 above, but continue **P2** driving another 1.1 miles south on Co. Rd. 45 to Carver Highlands Drive. Turn left. Drive straight about a half-mile to P2.


Louisville Swamp/Carver Rapids State Park and Refuge land between the railroad and the Minnesota River, south of the Bryan Rock Quarry, and north of Duck Lane and the Valley View Nursing Home.

Exit HWY 169 at 145th St. W. approximately 4.75 miles south of Shakopee. Parking is 1/2 mile in. Drive past the main entrance to the Renaissance Festival, over the next set of railroad tracks, and bear left.

Exit HWY 169 6-1/2 miles south of Shakopee on Bluff Drive. Drive 1/4-mile in to Jordan Ave. Turn right at Jordan Ave. Park at the edge of Jordan Ave. at least 100 vards from the house. You'll need to walk through private property to get to the gate. Please do so quietly.

Exit HWY 169 7.5 miles south of P5 Shakopee. Turn right on 173rd St. Drive 1/4 mile on 173rd St. W. to a "T" intersection at Valley View Drive. Turn right. Drive over the railroad tracks carefully. Parking is 1/8 mile beyond the tracks.

Rapids Lake and Louisville Swamp Units (DNR Deer Permit Area #337)



Jordan

Exit HWY 169 as described for P5 above. Turn left at the "T" intersection. Drive 1.5 miles south on Valley View Drive, past the Scott County Jail Annex, over the railroad tracks, and then turn right on Circle Drive. Drive 1 block uphill to Highview Drive. Turn left and drive 1 block to Mendoza Ave. Turn right on Mendoza and drive 1 block to Duck Lane. Turn right on Duck Lane. Hunter Parking Area is at the gate 1 mile N. 4-wheel drive is recommended until freeze-up.

P6

Hunter Parking P7 has been eliminated. Park in F8 and walk the mowed trail from there to the Middle Road. Hunter Parking is 1/4 mile west of P8 the Old HWY 18/101 Junction or right at the first light after you cross the new Hwy. 169 bridge and take the HWY 101 exit toward Shakopee.
