Come visit, explore and learn about Two Rivers National Wildlife Refuge. This 8,500-acre wildlife haven, located near the confluence of the Mississippi and Illinois Rivers, contains a diverse array of lands, wetlands and open-water habitats. Whether bird watching, fishing, hiking, hunting, or taking pictures, there are many ways to enjoy refuge lands!

Begin your visit at the refuge headquarters/visitor contact station located near the village of Brussels, Illinois. Discover the outdoor delights of one of over 500 refuges in the National Wildlife Refuge System.

All lands and waters of Two Rivers National Wildlife Refuge are open for public use during daylight hours, except from October 15 - December 31, when most of the refuge is closed in order to provide sanctuary for migratory birds.

Brochures, public use regulations and species lists are available at the refuge headquarters. Normal office hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. While the visitor contact station is occasionally open on weekends, it is recommended visitors call ahead to verity.
