



#### U.S. Horticultural Product Exports To Canada And Mexico Have Benefited From Free Trade




#### Free Trade Has Also Boosted U.S. Horticultural Imports From Mexico And Canada






## U.S. Fresh Horticultural Sales To Mexico Also Reached A Record In CY 1999




#### Apples Are The Major U.S. Fresh Produce Exported To Mexico










#### Tomatoes Are The Main Fresh Produce The United States Imports From Mexico









#### Lettuce Is The Leading U.S. Horticultural Product Exported To Canada




## U.S. Imports Of Canadian Horticultural Products Have Tripled Since 1990




#### 30 Percent The Value Of Total U.S. Horticultural Product Imports From Canada



#### Potato & Potato Products Are The Main Horticultural Produce The United States Imports From Canada




### Mexico Imports Most Horticultural Products From The United States





## Canada Imports Most Horticultural Products From The United States






