12	LEVINE	Anyway Bill, a couple of things.

4 5 6 7 8	LEVINE	This, this uh, uh, all uh, germinated from Bauman and Lincoln and um, uh, KBS. They had at one time bought distressed property. And they had some spectacular uh, uh, returns.

10 11	LEVINE	And of course they get the incentive fee.
12	CELLINI	Mm hm.

Now they agreed at one point to defer their uh, their incentive fee so they can't get more than 1.75 of percent of assets in any one given year. So they, they're being paid out. Their current returns are not stellar. So Bauman's got a bug up his ass, why am I paying for some former administration uh, all these fees out to these guys and they're not, they're not doin' such a great uh, job now. Now the fact is they, they earned it.

28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38	LEVINE	Now, so what he's decided to do is to change the um, uh, uh, the pay structure on a, fee structure for all the asset managers and if they don't want to, to do what it is then uh, he'll fire 'em. And then he won't have to pay the fees. They're owed about maybe, Lincoln's about paid out, I guess it says here that like chchchchKSB still has uh, a few millions uh, coming to 'em yet. But this was earned fees.

And there's a number of things in this plan that he's got that he hasn't completely thought out for example, if it's six percent of uh, revenues after uh, uh, (UI) percent cash flow after normal property expenses. Well, maybe that means that uh, there's a lot of maintenance that has to, to go on uh, the property manager won't wanna do it because uh, it'll interfere with his uh, six percent.
