

Backcountry Permits

Klondike Beach is designated as the backcountry area of Canaveral National Seashore. Visitors who enter this area are required to obtain a permit prior to entering the backcountry area. Permits cost \$2.00 per person, and are available at the park entrance stations. The permit is only valid for the date specified on the permit. Persons with valid backcountry permits are required to exit the Park prior to closing.

Klondike Beach (the backcountry) is defined as the area of the Park bounded on the west by the dune line, on the east by the Atlantic Ocean, on the south by a line running perpendicular to the dune line grid at marker number 73 and on the north by a line running perpendicular to the dune line at grid marker number 29. In general terms, this is the area located slightly south of parking lot #5 at Apollo Beach, and slightly north of parking lot #13 at Playalinda Beach.

This section of the Park is designated as “backcountry” and is limited to 25 persons per day on the south end of the beach and 25 persons per day on the north end of the beach; permit required.

Violators are subject to a \$150.00 fine.
