"CANOE MOSQUITO LAGOON"

FRIDAY 8th, 22nd, 29th -9:00 AM TO 12:00 PM - Reservations will begin a week before the canoe date. Join a guide as you explore this rich and diverse estuary up close. Some experience is preferred. You must be at least 8 years old and able to paddle. You must wear covered shoes (no sandals or flip-flops). Bring water, sunscreen and a hat. Dress to get wet. "COAST TO COAST"
