#### **TURTLE WATCH PROGRAMS:**

##### **RESERVATIONS BEGIN SUNDAY JUNE 15<sup>th</sup> FOR JULY PROGRAMS**

Journey with a National Park Ranger on a visit to the undisturbed beaches to watch a loggerhead sea turtle nesting. The program will take place in the North District New Smyrna Beach and the South District Titusville. The fee for this program is \$14.00 per person ages 16 and above, 15 and under are free. Children must be 8 years old to participate. Turtle Watch programs give park visitors an opportunity to learn about sea turtles and the role that the National Park Service plays in their conservation. RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED and SPACE IS LIMITED, there are some spots still available for June, you may call now to reserve those spots. Reservations for July programs will be taken by phone no earlier than 9 AM June 15<sup>th</sup> Call (386) 428-3384 ext. 18 to reserve space

**WEDNESDAY, JUNE 11<sup>TH</sup> -11:00 AM- "BEACH TREASURE HUNT"** Pick up your score card from the Information Center and see how many treasures you can find. Walk the beach for fun and exercise for about 1 mile. Bring sunscreen, hats and water. Meet at the Visitor Information Center. (1 hour)

**WEDNESDAY, JUNE 18<sup>TH</sup>-2:00 PM-“STORY OF THE ARROWHEAD”** Learn the story of the National Park Service Arrowhead and what it symbolizes. Then create your own signs to let people know how to protect and preserve the endangered species we have in our park. Dress to get messy. All supplies provided. Meet at the Visitor Information Center. (1 hour)

**THURSDAY, JUNE 19<sup>TH</sup> -1:00 PM- “HOOK, LINE AND SINKER”** Bait, rigs and tackle tips will be discussed for surf fishing on Apollo Beach, along with the rules and regulations for keeping what you catch. Bring water and sunscreen. We have a few rods; feel free to bring your own. Meet at the Visitor Information Center. (2 hour)

**WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25<sup>TH</sup>-10:00 AM-“JELLYFISH FUN”** Bring your imagination and create beautiful and original art inspired by the mysterious jellyfish. Supplies are provided. Dress to get messy. Meet at the Visitor Information Center. (1 hour)

**THURSDAY, JUNE 26<sup>TH</sup>-1:00 PM- “FISH MOSQUITO LAGOON”** Learn tips and tricks for fishing the waters of Mosquito Lagoon. Bring your own tackle if you can, we have some supplies. Bring water and sunscreen. Meet at the Visitor Information Center. (2 hours)

**SUNDAY, JUNE 29<sup>TH</sup>-1:00 PM-“SEA TURTLE TALK”** Join a park ranger to learn about the nesting sea turtles of Canaveral National Seashore. Discuss the results of last season and what is expected of the upcoming nesting season. Meet at the Visitor Information Center. (1 hour)
