TURTLE WATCH PROGRAMS:

RESERVATIONS ARE BEING TAKEN FOR JULY PROGRAMS.

Journey with a National Park Ranger on a visit to the undisturbed beaches to watch a loggerhead sea turtle nesting. The program will take place in the North District New Smyrna Beach and the South District Titusville. The fee for this program is \$14.00 per person ages 16 and above, 15 and under are free. Children must be 8 years old to participate. Turtle Watch programs give park visitors an opportunity to learn about sea turtles and the role that the National Park Service plays in their conservation. RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED and SPACE IS LIMITED, there are some spots still available for June, you may call now to reserve those spots. Reservations for July programs will be taken by phone.
