**Elko Field Office, 775-753-0200
3900 E. Idaho Street, Elko, NV 89801**

Wilson Reservoir – 83 miles northwest of Elko via State Route 225 to State Route 226, the last 16 miles on gravel road. Elevation 5,300 feet, 15 campsites, tables, fire rings, vault toilets, dump station, hand pump water, boat ramp fee \$2 per visit, camping fee \$4 per vehicle per night. Accessible late April through October.

North Wildhorse Campground – 70 miles north of Elko on State Route 225. Elevation 6,200 feet, 18 campsites, tables, fire rings, grills, three group sites, vault toilets, hand pump water, gravel roads, camping fee \$6 per vehicle, per night. Drinking water not available. Open late May through October. Scenic drives and mountain biking opportunities nearby.

Zunino/Jiggs Reservoir – 30 miles southeast of Elko via State Route 227 to State Route 228. Elevation 5,600 feet. Open camping on north and south shores only. Tables, grills, vault toilet in day use area, no drinking water, fee \$2.

Tabor Creek – 30 miles northwest of Wells on mostly gravel road. Elevation 6,000 feet, 10 campsites, tables, fire rings, vault toilet, no drinking water, fee \$2. Accessible mid-April through late November. Mountain biking, hiking and fishing nearby.

**Winnemucca Field Office, 775-623-1500

Onion Valley Reservoir – 28 miles south of Denio Junction. Six semi-primitive campsites for tents or tent trailers, two vault toilets, fire grills, tables, no fee. Accessible mid-June through mid October.

Water Canyon – 4 1/2 miles southeast of Winnemucca. Primitive camping, no facilities, no fee.

Sonoma Creek – 15 miles south of Winnemucca. Primitive camping, no facilities, no fee.

Flowering Wells – 24 miles northeast of Gerlach. Primitive camping, no facilities, no fee.

Indian Creek – 7 miles north of Markleeville on Highway 89. Nineteen sites for RVs or tents. A second area has 10 sites for tents only and features grills, tables and tent pads. Flush toilets, hot showers, drinking water and a sanitary dump station are provided. A reservable group campsite that holds up to 40 people is available for \$50 per night. Fees: RV/tent sites in main campground \$20/\$32 per night; tent only, walk-in sites \$14/\$20 per night. Open May through September.

Walker Lake – 15 miles north of Hawthorne on U.S. 95. Sportsman's Beach offers 40 sites, tables, vault toilets, fire rings and boat launch. \$6 per night for developed sites and \$4 per night for undeveloped sites. Other sites along the lake: The Cove, camping; Twenty Mile Beach, camping, fishing and boating; Tamarack, camping, day use and boating; East Shore, camping, day use and boating.

Wilson Canyon – 20 miles south of Yerington on Highway 208. Camping, vault toilet and off-highway vehicle parking.

Sand Mountain – 25 miles east of Fallon on U.S. 50. Designated camping near base of Sand Mountain, vault toilet, dumpsters, off-highway vehicle use. No water available. Fee area. Annual pass \$95; seven-day pass \$40; Tuesday and Wednesday, free.

Nevada has a 14-day camping limit at all sites.

Cleve Creek – 12 miles north of U.S. Hwy. 6-50 in north Spring Valley. Elevation 6233 feet. Travel trailers 24 ft. maximum. Good stream fishing with a variety of campsites. No fees. No drinking water.

Goshute Canyon – Primitive campground near the lower end of Goshute Creek in the Cherry Creek Range. Elevation 6,230 feet. No toilet, high-clearance vehicles recommended.

Illipah Reservoir – 37 miles west of Ely on U.S. Hwy 50, turn at the highway sign for Illipah Reservoir and continue 0.1 miles to a road junction, turn left and continue 1.3 miles to the campground. Elevation 6,840 feet. No size limit for travel trailers.

Meadow Valley Campground -- 1/2 mile south of Spring Valley State Park, near Pioche. Elevation 5,740 feet. Travel trailers and RVs not recommended. Camping is primitive with no facilities or fees. Fishing and hiking opportunities.

Knob Hill Primitive Camping

This area south of Nelson and north of Searchlight and is primarily used by hunters, rock climbers and local campers. Directions: Highway 95 south to white county sign for Nelson turnoff. Take road two miles east to power line road. Take power line road east four miles to granite outcropping.

Logandale Trails System Primitive Camping

Campsites with some tables are found along the 13 mile loop. Directions: follow I-15 to Logandale exit 93. Turn right on Liston Drive, 3.3 miles on State Route 169, immediately after Post Office. Follow road 5.6 miles to trails system.

Virgin Mountains Primitive Camping

Virgin Mountains offers primitive camping east of Mesquite.

Directions: Highway 15 to Mesquite. Follow road to Bunkerville. After concrete bridge, turn left.

Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area Campground

This campground features 71 developed campsites and five group sites. Most campsites include a picnic table and grill with water and toilets nearby. No hookups are available. The fee is \$10 per night with a limit of 10 people and two vehicles per site. Group campsites are \$25 per night and are available for groups between 10 and 20 people. Advance payment is required. Reservations for group sites are required and may be made by calling 702-515-5350 between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Reservations for group sites may be made up to six months in advance, but no later than one week in advance. The access road into the campground is limited to campers only between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Directions: the campground is on Highway 159, two miles east of the Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area visitor center and four miles west of Interstate 215.

Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area Primitive Camping

Several backcountry camping locations are available at Red Rock Canyon. Please call 702-515-5050 for information, directions and to obtain a permit.

Hickson Petroglyphs – 24 miles east of Austin. Year-round use, 16 campsites, day-use area, small to mid-sized RVs can be accommodated, two vault type toilets, no water, grills, tables and trash cans. No fee. 1/2 mile ADA accessible interpretive trail.

Mill Creek – 24 miles south of Battle Mountain on State Route 305. Year-round use, 11 tent camp sites, three RV sites, two accessible sites, one dual accessible vault-type toilet, day-use area, tables, grills. No fee. No drinking water.
