Comparison is defined as the forms of an adjective or adverb that indicate degrees in quality, quantity or manner. In English, those three levels or degrees are positive, comparative and superlative. Adjectives that end in “-er” are in the comparative form.</p> <p>The positive degree of comparison is the simple form. Examples are old or young (adjectives) or soon (an adverb).</p> <p>The comparative degree indicates a higher or lower degree of quality or manner than is expressed by the positive degree. The comparative is used when two things are compared and is usually formed by adding “-er” to the positive degree (older, sooner). In longer words, the comparative is formed by adding “more” or “less” to the positive, as in more efficient or less efficient.</p> <p>The superlative degree denotes the highest or lowest degree of quality or manner. The superlative is used when more than two things are compared and is usually formed by adding “-est” to the positive degree (oldest, soonest). Featured Cultural Content

Bowling	<p>The earliest record of bowling dates back to an Egyptian tomb from 5200 B.C., which contained a round object resembling a bowling ball and marble bars resembling bowling pins. In the intervening 7,000 years, bowling has taken many forms including lawn bowling, half-bowls, skittles, nine pins, duck pins and ten pins, which is our modern form of bowling.</p> <p>Bowlers roll a ball down a lane, trying to knock down ten pins that are set up in a triangular formation. If all ten are knocked down on the first try, that is called a strike. If some pins remain standing, the bowler gets one more try to knock down the remainder. If that is accomplished, it's called a spare. The bowler is awarded one point for every pin knocked down and bonuses for strikes and spares. A perfect game is twelve strikes in a row and is worth 300 points.</p> <p>The introduction of the automatic pinspotter in the 1940s eliminated the jobs of thousands of "pin boys" across the country, but it brought bowling into the modern era. Television began broadcasting bowling events in the 1950s, which also increased the sport's popularity with the masses. Today, over 72 million men, women and children in the United States bowl. That's about one in every three Americans.</p> <p>Bowlers of all ages may participate in bowling leagues, where they meet on a weekly basis and compete in teams against other bowlers of the same age or level of expertise.</p>
High School Proms in America	<p>A prom is a formal dance party given for junior and senior class students in high school. There are different occasions for the dances. The most common are the Homecoming Dance, Winter Dance, and the Junior-Senior Prom.</p> <p>Proms are big events and take a lot of preparation. Customarily, a boy will ask a girl to be his "prom date". Then, because it is a "formal" event, the girl will shop at a department store or a specialty shop for a formal dress and the boy for a tuxedo or a suit. Then comes selecting the accessories such as the flowers and jewelry that go with the dress the girl will wear. Prom night, the boy will usually go to his date's house to take her to the prom. The kids will look fabulous in their fancy clothes and many pictures will be taken before the couple leaves. Before they do, her parents will tell the boy to take good care of their daughter and not stay out too late.</p> <p>When they arrive at the prom, they find the dance hall decorated and filled with other students in their formal dress dancing to music. Teachers and school administrators may attend the prom as well to supervise. But it is the students that have most of the fun dancing, chatting with friends and getting their pictures taken.</p> <p>After the prom, many party-goers attend mini-gatherings with friends or with their dates. Some go to restaurants. This is when teachers and parents get a bit nervous for the kids' safety. They hope that the kids are having a good time and remember to act responsibly</p>
