REAL ESTATE APPRAISER RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS

For the January 1, 2006 – December 31, 2007 renewal period, all appraisers must:

- Demonstrate possession of the required hours of continuing education ("CE"); and
- Provide evidence of having taken a 7-hour National Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice ("USPAP") course or its equivalent during the renewal period. The 15-hour National USPAP course cannot be used to fulfill this requirement, but may be used for other required CE hours.

The number of CE hours required are as follows:

- Appraisers licensed prior to and including December 31, 2006 must provide proof of 28 hours of CE.
- Appraisers receiving their <u>first license or certificate</u> (new licensee or certifications that have not been upgraded) **from** January 1, 2007 to June 29, 2007 must provide proof of **14 hours** of CE.
- Appraisers receiving their first license or certificate (new licensee or certifications that have not been upgraded) after June 29, 2007 are not required to submit any proof of CE hours.

NOTE:

- The 7-hour National USPAP course is included in the total number of required hours mentioned above. The 15-hour National USPAP course will not be accepted to fulfill the USPAP requirement to renew your license, but may be used for other required CE hours.

REMINDER: All licensed and certified appraisers must take the 7-hour National USPAP course every two calendar years.
