Dear Chairman Regula and Congressman Obey:

As you consider the conference report for the fiscal year 2004 Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations bill, we the members of the Congressional Labor and Working Families Caucus, encourage you to adopt the Senate language addressing proposed changes by the Department of Labor (DoL) to overtime rules. It is our belief that these proposed changes jeopardize the fair and equitable treatment guaranteed to millions of American workers and their families by the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938.

As you know, Senator Tom Harkin (D-IA) offered an amendment in the Senate, which was adopted by a vote of 54-45, which would prohibit the use of any funds from this spending measure to promulgate or implement any regulation that would exclude millions of Americans from overtime compensation. Senator's Harkin's amendment will protect the overtime pay of millions of American workers while permitting the DoL to update overtime regulations to raise the salary threshold from \$8,000 to \$22,100 a year to qualify for overtime pay.

Additionally, the House of Representatives recently passed by a vote of 221-203, a motion to instruct House Conferees on the Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations Bill. This Motion instructs conferees to accept Senate-passed language to block the DoL's proposed rule changes denying overtime pay to millions of American workers.

It is estimated that the majority of occupations to be affected by DoL's proposed changes would be those on the front line protecting our nation from terrorism—our first responders and healthcare workers. It is our understanding that under these proposed regulations, over 5 million American workers will lose their access to overtime pay. If the Senate language is not included as part of this appropriations bill, workers will lose overtime protection and essentially be forced to work longer hours for less pay.

We urge your support for the preservation and extension of overtime protection. With the adoption of the Senate language, we would be renewing our commitment to working Americans. We appreciate your attention to this important matter.
