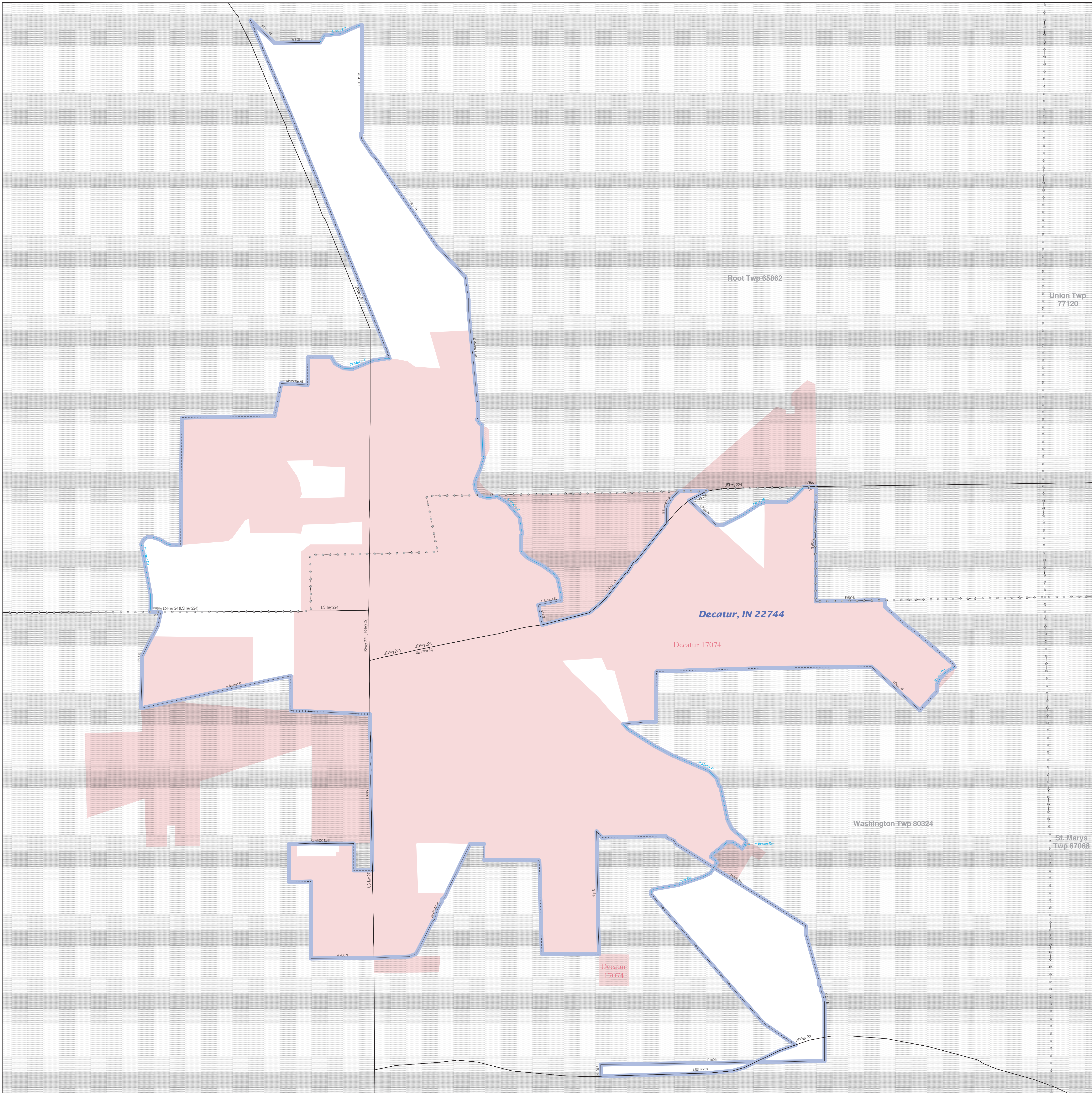


# URBAN CLUSTER OUTLINE MAP (CENSUS 2000)
