# **CURRENT RESERVOIR CONDITIONS:**

Elevation: 3609.88; Storage: 802,464 acre-feet; River Release: 1,900 cfs; Inflow: 1,770 cfs;

## **GENERAL COMMENTS:**

An inspection and maintenance of the spillway gates on the Yellowtail Afterbay Dam has been scheduled for May 7, 2008. During this time, **the level of the Afterbay must be maintained at or below elevation** 3179 to allow staff to safely inspect the spillway gates. In response, the following operation will be required at Yellowtail Dam, Powerplant, and Afterbay Dam.

NOTE: This is the time period when fish are more susceptible to high levels of nitrogen gas super-saturation. To provide a more desirable mixing flow of approximately 75% through the spillway gates and 25% through the sluice gates to maintain the total gas super-saturation levels at safe limits, the minimum Afterbay elevation should be maintained at or above elevation 3183 whenever possible. This is only a soft limit and may be deviated from during special or emergency operations.

### **SPECIAL OPERATIONS:**

During 1300 hour through 1600 hour during May 7, 2008:

Maintain level of the Afterbay at or below elevation 3179 to allow staff to safely inspect the spillway gates on the Afterbay Dam.

This special operation shall not interfere with or deviate from the previously scheduled releases to the Bighorn River.
