



Guaranteed Housing Loans

Eligibility: Applicants for loans may have an income of up to 115% of the median income for the area. <u>Area income limits for this program are here</u>. Families must be without adequate housing, but be able to afford the mortgage payments, including taxes and insurance. In addition, applicants must have reasonable credit histories.

Approved lenders under the Single Family Housing Guaranteed Loan program include:

Any State housing agency; Lenders approved by: HUD for submission of applications for Federal Housing Mortgage Insurance or as an issuer of Ginnie Mae mortgage backed securities; the U.S. Veterans Administration as a qualified mortgagee; Fannie Mae for participation in family mortgage loans; Freddie Mac for participation in family mortgage loans; Any FCS (Farm Credit System) institution with direct lending authority; Any lender participating in other USDA Rural Development and/or Farm Service Agency guaranteed loan programs.

Terms: Loans are for 30 years. The promissory note interest rate is set by the lender. There is no required down payment. The lender must also determine repayment feasibility, using ratios of repayment (gross) income to PITI and to total family debt.

Standards: Under the Section 502 program, housing must be modest in size, design, and cost. Houses constructed, purchased, or rehabilitated must meet the voluntary national model building code adopted by the state and HCFP thermal and site standards. New Manufactured housing must be permanently installed and meet the HUD Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards and HCFP thermal and site standards. Existing manufactured housing will not be guaranteed unless it is already financed with an HCFP direct or guaranteed loan or it is Real Estate Owned (REO) formerly secured by an HCFP direct or guaranteed loan.

2007 was a year of remarkable achievements in Tennessee. We embarked upon the Rural Renaissance; a new way of doing business that responds flexibly to real-world issues by empowering our people to deliver a complete portfolio of services and financial products that build rural communities literally from the ground up.

Together our team in Tennessee directly touched the lives of more than 600,000 people in rural parts of the state. Through loans and new economic infrastructure we helped nearly 900 rural businesses create or save more than 2,600 jobs. Most importantly, the impact of the nearly \$309 million we invested in rural businesses, housing and essential infrastructure will continue to positively impact people's health, safety, education, homes and livelihoods for years to come.

Productivity also increased again in 2007 thanks to the hard work and innovative ideas from our staff. Administrative costs were lowered to less than four cents per program dollar delivered to our communities. We work with private lenders, non-profit organizations, individual home-buyers, builders and real estate agents to increase the number of home-owners in rural communities and to provide opportunities for everyone to have a safe, accessible place to live. Guaranteed and direct home loans help families and individuals buy, build or repair affordable homes in rural areas with a population less than 20,000. Eligibility is based on family income and varies according to the county's average. Home repair and rental housing programs are generally delivered through non-profit partners and private lenders.
