

\$5,208,000 in 2002, \$9,138,000 in 1997, down 43 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$502,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,706,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$38,293 in 2002, \$62,160 in 1997, down 38 percent.


## **Government Payments**
