

# Number of farms

1,106 farms in 2002, 1,026 farms in 1997, up 8 percent.

#### Land in farms

278,352 acres in 2002, 319,783 acres in 1997, down 13 percent.

#### Average size of farm

252 acres in 2002, 312 acres in 1997, down 19 percent.

## **Market Value of Production**

\$14,614,000 in 2002, \$11,292,000 in 1997, up 29 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,986,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$10,627,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$13,213 in 2002, \$11,006 in 1997, up 20 percent.


## **Government Payments**
