

# Kent, Texas



#### **Number of farms**

182 farms in 2002, 188 farms in 1997, down 3 percent.

#### Land in farms

560,695 acres in 2002, 560,970 acres in 1997, down slightly.

3,081 acres in 2002, 2,984 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$5,281,000 in 2002, \$7,135,000 in 1997, down 26 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$680,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,601,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$29,016 in 2002, \$37,952 in 1997, down 24 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
