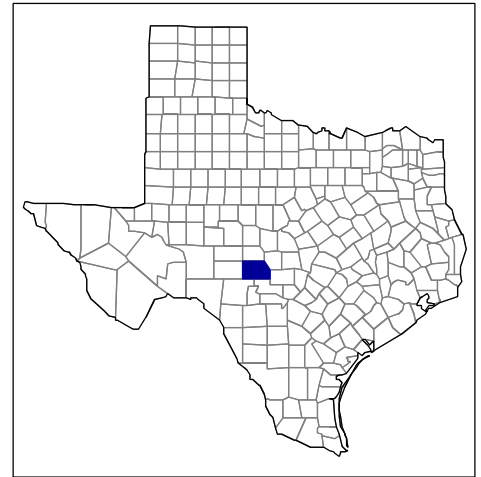


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

## Kimble, Texas

1,166 acres in 2002, 1,414 acres in 1997, down 18 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$7,356,000 in 2002, \$7,612,000 in 1997, down 3 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$655,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$6,702,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

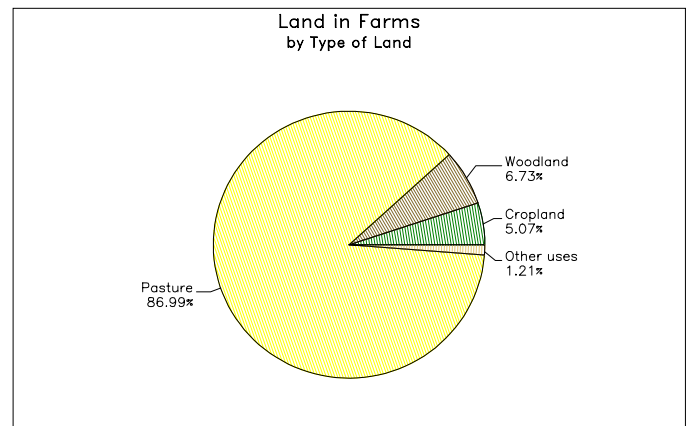
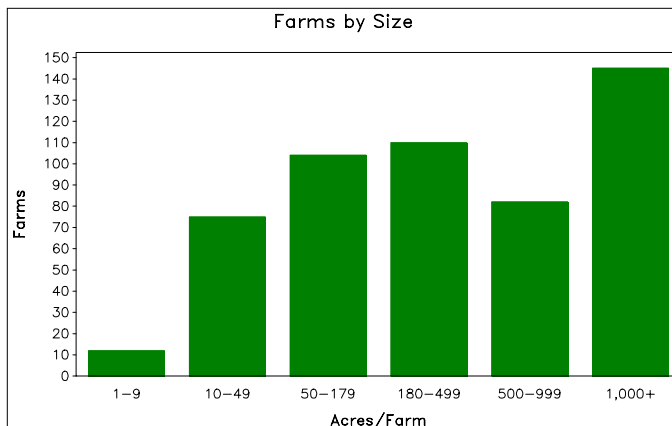
\$13,933 in 2002, \$13,214 in 1997, up 5 percent.
