

#### **Number of farms**

477 farms in 2002, 524 farms in 1997, down 9 percent.

#### Land in farms

361,558 acres in 2002, 876,726 acres in 1997, down 59 percent.

### Average size of farm

758 acres in 2002, 1,673 acres in 1997, down 55 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$7,401,000 in 2002, \$19,754,000 in 1997, down 63 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,994,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,407,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$15,516 in 2002, \$37,699 in 1997, down 59 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
